

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Effective Communication Practices

Set Expectations Up Front


First and most important key to online engagement

Keep Up the Pace

Every 3-5 minutes is the communication "sweet spot"

Keep the focus on the learners

Create opportunities for dialogue to promote discussion



"In many ways, effective communication begins with mutual respect, communication that inspires, encourages others to do their best."

Timely and Useful Fedback

Benefits Both Student AND Instructor

Helps adjust teaching and learning to help ensure shared goals

Stimulates Motivation and Deeper Learning

Students can practice and modify their behavior during the learning experience

Shows Instructor Presence

Demonstrates willingness to help students learn and support them until the course ends.

CONVERSATION STARTERS


Build a safe, fun learning enviornment




